EXPLORE THE AREA MARKED ON THE MAP TO FIND THE ANSWER TO EACH QUESTION. THEN USE YOUR ANSWERS TO SOLVE THE MYSTERY PHRASE.



1 Look inside the entry of the War Memorial Cultural Centre. How many figures can you see in the foyer?

1 There are two murals on either side of the entrance to the War Memorial Cultural Centre. Examine the mural on the left. How many figures are in this artwork?

2 What is the name of the egg sculpture created by Brett Whiteley in front of the Newcastle Art Gallery?

3 Visit the Memorial Grove in the southeast corner of Civic Park. This area honours servicemen and servicewomen that were killed in wars and conflicts and contains different memorial plaques and monuments. What is the type of bird that sits atop the Airforce Monument?

4 Look for the sculpture Corm near Newcastle City Hall on the way to Wheeler Place. This was given to the people of Newcastle to mark the 50th anniversary of Newcastle City Hall in 1980. Who was the sculpture from?

5 Visit the figure in front of the Visitor Information Centre (former Civic Station). This was Australia's first female mayor. What is her name?

6 Look for the long metal and timber seating platform in Museum Park. This was repurposed from the Civic Railway Station which was formerly at this location. What was the platform previously used as? (HINT: It's the title on the sign.)

7 Find the Ship to Shore Sculpture by Matthew Harding in Honeysuckle. How many knot structures are there?

8 Search for the circular history pole in Honeysuckle and read the inscription. This area was formerly used for maritime operations. The wharf was opened on 2 June 1910 and was named after the Minister of Works at the time. What was his name?

9 Look at the concrete and metal sculpture past the Honeysuckle Hotel. Engraved on it is a phrase "Long ago, this land here at Newcastle was covered in..." What was it covered in?
